Haudenosaunee Environmental Task Force for the Onondaga Nation

Environmental Technician

The Onondaga Nation seeks an Environmental Technician to work with the Haudenosaunee Environmental Task Force (HETF), a consortium of the Traditional Haudenosaunee Nations working on environmental programs for the Haudenosaunee.

The Environmental Technician will assist in the development, organization, coordination and management of environmental programs for the Onondaga Nation. The Environmental Technician will also work on special projects, such as the Natural Resources Damage Assessment of the Onondaga Lake Superfund Site.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Synthesizing the Haudenosaunee culture into the Onondaga Lake Superfund Site technical documents, and provide substantive comments to other government agencies;
- Development of culturally-based environmental education programs and resources for the Onondaga Nation community, including submissions to the *Onondaga Communications* newsletter;
- Compliance with HETF reporting, finance and personnel policy requirements, including attendance at HETF meetings and conference calls;
- Attend training regarding environmental resource management, protection, and restoration;
- Other reasonable duties assigned.

Job Specifications

Candidates must have a strong commitment to working with the Onondaga Nation and the Haudenosaunee Confederacy and effectively advocating for the Onondaga Nation's environmental matters with local, state, federal agencies, other Indian Nation governments and non-governmental organizations.

Candidates must have a broad interest in environmental issues, strong oral/reading and writing skills and a working knowledge of computers. Most importantly the candidate must have a strong desire in learning the Onondaga language and maintaining the Haudenosaunee culture.

This will be a full time position and is opened until the position is filled. Native American preference.
